COVID-19 Update

In the past week we have had one additional positive test among the residents in the RCAC apartments. We have also had one additional staff person test positive. The staff person will affect both Health Center 1 and Health Center 2. All the residents in Health Center 1 tested negative earlier today and we are still waiting on the results from Health Center 2.

Health Center 1 & 2 are considered to be in Outbreak Mode. Their Free Day will be Thursday May 20th. N-95 masks and face shields will be required for staff working in Health Center 1 and 2 as well as the residential apartment areas.

There have been no new cases in Westview and they remain with no restrictions as far as activities and daily routines.

All areas are open for visitors but hospital masks and face shields will be required for all visitors. If you do choose to visit a loved one please use extra precautions during this period.

Current data shows that there have now been 3,639 cases of COVID-19 in the county. This is up 28 cases from what was reported in last weeks edition. Currently there have been 40 deaths reported in the county.

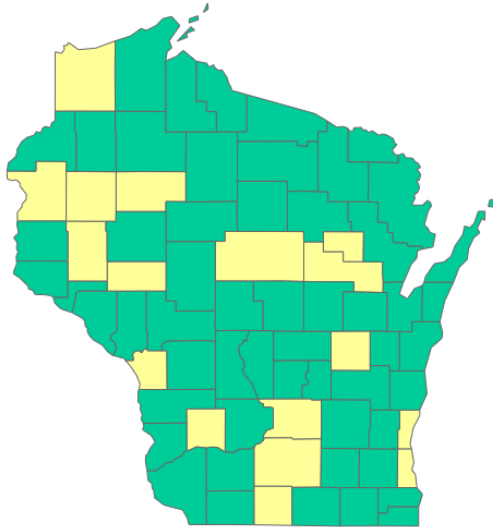

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has changed the indicators it is using to monitor the impact of COVID-19 on communities. The map, shown below, illustrates the current levels for each county in Wisconsin. Community levels measure the impact of COVID-19 illness on health and health care systems in communities.

This weeks map shows 17 counties with medium activity and 55 counties with low activity. Last weeks map showed 5 with medium activity , 2 with high activity and 69 with low activity. The number of counties having medium or high activity rates increased by 10 counties in the last week. Unfortunately, Richland County was one of those counties that jumped from low to medium activity in the past week.
