As previously reported, both Westview and the Health Center remain in Outbreak Mode. We have not gone through the mandatory 14 days of all negative tests in either area which is required to stand down from Outbreak Mode.


Westview Assisted Living status—Outbreak Mode: All Westview residents except the three that had previously tested positive, were tested again on Thursday the 19th. All of these test came back as negative which is certainly good news. The first of the three residents to test positive remains asymptomatic and is being released from quarantine today. This is certainly all good news.

The last staff person in Westview to test positive came on Friday the 13th, how ironic. Therefore, allowing for the 14 days of all negative tests, the soonest we could expect to come out of the Outbreak Mode would November 28th.

Health Center status—Outbreak Mode: All Health Center residents were tested on Tuesday November 17th. All these test results came back negative. The Health Center residents will be tested again on Monday November 23rd.

Richland County Update

Richland County health officials announced that as of 2:30 pm on Thursday the 19th there have been a total of 756 positive COVID-19 cases in Richland County. 286 of those cases are still considered active and there have been 12 deaths related to complications from the virus. This is up two from what was reported to you on Wednesday. For whatever reason the county site was not updated today, as of this edition being ready to distribute.
